Residents can take their leaves, sticks, and brush to the city compost site on Butterfield Hwy. The drop-off area is on the right-hand side as you pull in the driveway and the brush goes farther back, just before the fenced-in tower. Please follow the signs.

Building materials are not allowed at the site and, if found, may cause the city to close the program.
